## RESOLUTION NO. 21-562

## RESOLUTION TO RENEW A SIX-YEAR EMS LEVY

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Commissioners (the "Board") of San Juan County Public Hospital District No. 1 (the "District") providing for the submission to the voters of the District at a special election to be held therein on February 8, 2022, a proposition to renew a sixyear Emergency Medical Services Levy ("EMS Levy") at a levy rate of $\$ 0.45$ or less per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, each year for a period of six consecutive years, to be levied each year beginning in 2022 and ending in 2027 and to be collected in each year succeeding the year of the levy to provide funds required by the District to enable the District to continue to provide emergency medical services.

WHEREAS, the District currently has a six-year EMS Levy for which collection will cease in 2022;

WHEREAS, it is the judgment of the Board of Commissioners of San Juan County Public Hospital District No. 1 that it is essential and necessary for the protection of the health and life of the residents of the District that emergency medical services continue to be provided by the District.

WHEREAS, the District desires to renew the EMS Levy for a six-year period in order to continue providing emergency medical services at existing service levels.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of San Juan County Public Hospital District No. 1 as follows:

Section 1. In order to provide emergency medical services, it is necessary that the District perform the following functions:
1.1 Obtain, operate, and maintain emergency medical vehicles and facilities staffed by properly trained emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and other medically trained personnel.
1.2 Obtain consumable medical supplies and medical appliances to equip such vehicles and facilities.

Section 2. In order to provide the revenue adequate to pay the costs of providing adequate life protection services and facilities as described in Section 1, the District shall levy each year for a period of six consecutive years beginning in 2022 and collect each year for a period of six consecutive years, beginning in 2023, a general tax on taxable property within the District in an amount not to exceed $\$ 0.45$ per $\$ 1,000.00$ of assessed valuation of such property.

Section 3. In accordance with RCW 84.52.069, the funds raised by such levy shall be used only for the provision of emergency medical services, including related personnel costs, training for such personnel and related equipment, supplies, vehicles and structures needed for the provision of emergency medical services.

Section 4. ELECTION. The Auditor of San Juan County, Washington, as ex officio Supervisor of Elections (the "Auditor"), is requested to call and conduct a special election within the jurisdictional boundaries of the District, in the manner provided by law, to be held herein on February 8, 2022 for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the District, for their approval or rejection, a proposition renewing a six-year EMS Levy of $\$ 0.45$ or less per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, to be made each year for a period of six consecutive years, the first levy to be made in 2022 and to be collected in 2023.

Section 5. BALLOT TITLE AND PROPOSITION. Pursuant to RCW 84.52.069 and 29A.36.210, the San Juan County Prosecuting Attorney is requested to prepare the concise description of the aforesaid proposition for the ballot title in substantially the following form:

PROPOSITION 1

## RENEWAL OF SIX-YEAR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PROPERTY TAX LEVY

Will San Juan County Public Hospital District No. 1 be authorized to impose regular property tax levies of $\$ 0.45$ or less per $\$ 1,000.00$ of assessed valuation for six consecutive years?


Section 6. CERTIFICATION. The Superintendent of the District is directed to (a) certify to the Auditor a copy of this Resolution No. 21-562 showing its adoption by the Board no later than December 10, 2021; and (b) perform such other duties as are necessary and required by law in submitting to the voters of the District at the aforesaid election the foregoing proposition.

Section 7. IMPLEMENTATION. The Superintendent of the District is authorized to implement such administrative procedures as may be necessary to carry out the directives of this legislation.

Section 8. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon passage and signatures hereon.

## EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The current six-year Emergency Medical Services Levy for San Juan County Public Hospital District No. 1 expires in 2021. This measure renews the six-year Emergency Medical Services Levy for six consecutive years. Funds raised by this EMS levy will only be used to provide emergency medical services, including related personnel costs, training for such personnel, and related equipment, supplies, vehicles, and structures needed for the provision of emergency medical services. The levy amount will be established at the rate of $\$ 0.45$ per $\$ 1,000$ of assessed valuation. Voter approval of Proposition No. 1 will provide funding for the District to continue to provide emergency medical services at current levels.
